Warehousing and Storage

- Primary role:
 - Receiving
 - Storing
 - Forwarding of goods



- Packaging
- Labeling
- Tracking





Warehousing and Storage

- Sector covers a wide range of different storage options
 - Outdoor Yards
 - Silos Agricultural or flammable products
 - Refrigerated Storage
 - Etc.
- Tends to be dominated by a large number of small enterprises.
- Only B2B



Similarities Across the Sector

- Small sector within ISIC 52
- Warehousing and Storage as a service is becoming more prevalent – move away from being an extension of factory
- Addition of VAS can make pricing trickier
- Companies tend to specialize in certain product storage
- Sector is very similar worldwide



Measurement of Sector

- Output
 - Census
 - Annual Surveys
 - Periodic Surveys

- Prices
 - Contract Pricing
 - Average Unit Price
 - Direct Use of Prices of Repeated Services (less common)



Challenges in SPPI

- Choosing a pricing method Italy uses contract pricing, BLS has moved more towards average pricing
- Quality adjustment Warehousing and Storage sector becoming more automated, more VAS available.
- Bundling of Services How do prices differ from prices collected for similar activities in other sectors
- Full Coverage of Sector? Private storage market



Challenges in Output/Turnover

- Difficulties associated with tax data:
 - Changes in legal regulations
 - Negative values
 - Etc.
- Sector tends to be unconcentrated

Overlap with Other Industries

- Low barrier for entry into sector
- Overlap with other aspects of the transportation and storage industry
- W&S activities provided as secondary activities may be missed
- E.g. Large Transport providers are branching out to offer a complete bundled service to customers







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
