





















How are employment services measured in Mexico?



Sector 56 Administrative and Support Services, accounts for 17.1% of total income of private non-financial services.

5613 **Employment** Industry group Services, supplies personnel to other establishments, which in turn assume employer and tax responsibilities.



Need to adapt the data collection instruments.



Results of the 2024 Economic Censuses on employment services in Mexico, main variables









Revenue index of Employment Services

January 2018 to June 2025 (2018=100)












Employed Personnel index of Employment Services

January 2018 to June 2025 (2018=100)












Remuneration index Employment Services

VI. FINAL REMARKS

The outsourcing reform complicated data collection, but methodological adjustments ensured reliable results in Employment Services.

The 2024 Economic Censuses confirm a decrease in variables related to Employment Services, reflecting the disappearance of the supply of permanent personnel.

The 2023 Series will more accurately reflect the adaptation of economic units to the new regulation.

The Mexican experience highlights the importance of updated sampling frames and flexible methodologies to ensure reliable results.
